



## Supervised Patrol Form

(Volunteer's and Coordinator's Copy)

The two supervised patrols will be fully recognised as part of the practical aspect of the course. Therefore, the new volunteer is expected to attend, participate and have a feedback session with his or her street pastor coordinator.

<b>Communication</b>	Talk to and interact with individuals and groups in the street environment.	
	Read other people's body language and be aware your own.	
	Use the appropriate listening skills in a given situation.	
	Knowledgeable about Street Pastors policies and procedures.	
	Be aware of how you use 'why' questions.	
<b>Self-awareness</b>	Stay calm in the presence of others' difficult emotions.	
	Know which emotions you are feeling and why.	
	Recognise how your feelings may affect your role as a Street Pastor.	
	Be aware that the people you meet may not share your goals and values.	
<b>Team Work</b>	Be aware of your impact on your team mates.	
	While on patrol, be fully observant of where your team mates are.	
	Provide encouraging support to the members of your team while on patrol.	
	Focus on the purpose of the patrol.	
<b>Understanding Differences</b>	Be able to build bridges to others who appear to be different and under different influences than yourself.	
	Be objective and avoid acting on assumptions.	
	Ask questions to test your assumptions and perspectives.	
	Respect other people's cultures.	
<b>Teachable</b>	Willingness to learn from your experiences and the experiences of your team.	
	Reflect on each patrol – looking for learning points.

NB. At the end of each patrol or at another suitable time, the volunteer will meet with the coordinator or designate for an informal debriefing session. We also recommend that a copy of the signed and dated patrol form is kept on file for future reference.
